##### Student Success:

- Picture on school website
- Picture on CCTV
- LCD Name in Lights
  - Available at Sam's Club
  - BETAbrite Full color Message Sign 37143
    - 199.88
    - Do a fund raiser to pay for sign
- Marquee outside
- Picture in school newsletter
- Picture in local newspaper
- Special Note Home from Vendors

##### Staff Success:

- LCD Name in Lights
- Picture on CCTV
- Picture on school website
  - Special Parking Spot – Labeled in front of school
  - Special Parking Privileges
  - Limo ride to duty free lunch (call your local funeral parlor)
  - G.O.O.S.E. them
  - Plunger Award
  - Light Bulb Award
  - Free “Get out of Jail” Card for a free duty

##### Parent Showcase:

- Parents who come up and pass out “gotchas” in the hallway
- Parents who donate time and energy to “paying off” for students
  - For example:
    - Parents who come up and play chess with students who earned gotchas
    - Parents who came up and taught students how to throw a football for earning gotchas
    - Parents who came up and helped supervise a school dance an extra hour for those students who earned the appropriate number of gotchas
- Blog on cool things that kids come home and say about school
  - This would have to be moderated- (this means information goes through a gatekeeper who makes sure the information on the blog is positive)

#### Things to highlight on your website:

- Get a sponsor to cover the expense of the food
  - Invite parents of children who have received a certain number of gotchas in a month
    - Donuts for Dads
    - Muffins for Moms
    - Granola for Grandparents
    - Chili and Karaoke night
    - Lunch lady antics (Adam Sandler style)
    - Plaza Art Fair and Food Tasting
      - (Get restaurants to set up sample booths)
      - Display art work gallery style for all students who have a certain number of gotchas
